Pebble beach located on the southern coast of England about an hour south of London. It's one of the best known

beaches in the UK.

CASTLES (13)

Beautifully intact and preserved 14th-century castle surrounded by a full moat. A must see while living in East England.

Sprawling 17th-century castle built over the site of a medieval 12th -century castle. Ruins to explore as well as

intact castle towers and walls to climb and walk along.

12th-century castle just north of King's Lynn with one of the best preserved stone keeps in England. It's surrounded by impressive earthworks that give the appearance of a dry moat.

Huge 11th-century castle that has been refitted over the centuries for its important defensive complex. No visit is complete without touring the secret wartime tunnels used in WWII.

13th century castle and brief residence of "Bloody" Mary. Walk the castle walls and explore the open courtyard and dry moat.

Privately owned 12th-century stone keep castle with four floors to wander through and extensive grounds/woods to explore.

12th-century castle that was expanded and improved in the late 14th century. It was occupied much longer than similar medieval castles and has a fascinating history.

Beautiful, privately owned 19th-century castle on an island in the center of a lake. The original castle on the site dated back to the 12th-century and was a popular residence for multiple kings.

Reconstructed castle with its origins dating back to William the Conqueror in 1068. Now owned by Merlin Entertainment group, it's a popular tourist destination.

Just west of London, it's the largest and oldest occupied castle in Europe. The magnificent castle has undergone numerous rebuilds since it was initially founded in the 11th-century.

CHURCHES & HISTORIC SITES (14)

Abbey of Bury St. Edmunds (EH): http://www.english-heritage.org.uk/visit/places/bury-st-edmunds-abbey

Once home to a wealthy and powerful Benedictine monastery founded in the 11th-century, its ruins now lie in the heart of Bury St Edmunds with its 14th-century Norman Gate still intact.

12th-century priory converted to a country house in the 17th-century with a lavish interior on the outskirts of Cambridge. Its extensive gardens and outdoor play areas are equally impressive.

17th-century palatial country house with extensive gardens and grounds along the River Cam.

Glamorous 17th-century country mansion with vast grounds and gardens and one of the largest adventure playgrounds in the region.

This stunning cathedral is the oldest in Britain and dates its founding back to St. Augustine in 597. It was extensively rebuilt in the 12th-century following a fire and its rich history includes the murder of Archbishop Thomas Becket by the knights of King Henry II.

This small monastery was built in the 11th-century and remained active until the mid 16th-century. Exploring the impressive ruins and the remnants of Castle Acre Castle just down the road is a great way to spend an afternoon. Post code: PE32 2XD, Distance: 40 minutes

Considered one of England's most beautiful cathedrals, it has become a frequent filming location for popular movies. It was founded in 672 but the present structures date back to the 11th century. In addition to touring the main level, tower tours are also available.

15th-century gothic chapel at King's College in the University of Cambridge. The chapel is known for its beautiful stained glass windows and its ceiling boast the world's largest fan vault.

This 12th-century church is considered the most complete existing Norman cathedral in England. It has the second tallest spire and second largest cloisters (covered walkway) in England.

Scenic 15th-century country manor surrounded by a moat. While not a castle, Henry VII and Elizabeth once visited and famous needlework panels stitched by Mary, Queen of Scots hang on its walls. The 70-acre estate is full of beautiful walking trails and gardens.

Second oldest cathedral in England, established by Justus who accompanied St. Augustine to England in the early 7th century. The current cathedral was built and modified over the original church from the 12th-15th centuries. Post code: ME1 1SX, Distance: 1 hour, 40 minutes

18th-century country house and private estate owned by the Queen. The Royal Family spends Christmas here each year.

Outdoor heritage museum and archaeological site with huts reconstructed on the location of a 5th-7th century Anglo-Saxon village. The site hosts kids' digs, archery lessons, and living history exhibits throughout the year. Post code: IP28 6HG, Distance: 15 minutes

This working estate includes an impressive mansion, a rare breeds animal farm, extensive 18th-century gardens, and an adventure playground for kids.

FARMS (4)

Rare breeds farm open year round with horse, sheep, pigs, chickens, and rabbits. Also offers an indoor play area, adventure playground, and tractor rides.

140-acre "mixed" farm. Its farm trail is open year round and includes sheep, goats, chicken, rabbits, alpacas, and cattle with kid-friendly activities such as rope swings, climbing poles, and slides interspersed.

Rare breeds farm park and shop open year round. Animals include pigs, emus, goats, reindeer, alpacas, cows, donkeys, and horses. There's also a butterfly house and several children's play areas.

FORESTS & ADVENTURE PLAYGROUNDS (5)

Tucked away at the back of the gardens and ruins of the Abbey at Bury St. Edmunds are three outdoor play areas. There's a traditional playground, a sand play area, and a small tree house for older kids.

Huge forest treehouse adventure park with rope bridges, slides, zip lines, a maze, rides, and more. Designed for children ages 2-12 and their families.

This extensive outdoor recreation facility in Thetford Forest is the largest man-made lowland forest in the UK.

Tons of walking and biking trails, playgrounds, tree houses, and a high ropes course.

The base for Britain's code-breaking efforts during WWII is now a popular heritage attraction for all ages.

Considered to be one of England's best preserved medieval towns, many of Lavenham's crooked buildings date back to the 1300s.

Rows of lavender that stretch for 25 miles. Walk through the fields, pick flowers, and take plenty of photos. Best time to visit is July when the flowers are in full bloom.

Home to horse races attended by royalty since at least the 17th century, the sport of racing is still very much alive at this course over 350 years later. Check out their events for upcoming family fun days and races.

This historic airfield is the home of Britain's largest aviation museum with over 200 aircraft and military vehicles. The museum hosts annual air shows and hangers used in the Battle of Britain are still in use and can be toured. Post code: CB22 4OR, Distance: 35 minutes

Explore historic Cambridge by boat on the River Cam. Punting guides give a concise history of the University's colleges and interesting residents while you relax and take in the scenic views along the river.

Karting and go-karting track in Red Lodge. Minimum age to ride is seven for their slower carts (and meet height requirements).

Birthplace of Shakespeare and location of five major Shakespeare heritage sites (his birth home, his final home, his wife's childhood cottage, etc). The scenic town along the River Avon is an excellent way to spend a day out. Post code: CV37 6GW, Distance: 2 hours, 20 minutes

Seal Watching at Blakeney Point or Horsey Beach:

Blakeney Point is a nature reserve on the north coast of Norfolk and popular start point for seal sighting boat trips. Seals can be found birthing/nursing their pups along Horsey Beach in winter and molting in early spring. Post code: NR25 7NQ (Blakeney) and NR29 4EF (Horsey), Distance: 90 minutes

ZOOS/SAFARI PARKS (4)

50-acre zoo with over 2000 animals including giraffes, lemurs, snow leopards, zebras, Siberian tigers, cheetahs, meerkats, and red pandas.

Widely considered one of the best zoos in the UK, it sits on 60-acres of land with over 270 species of animals in a large array of themed habitat zones. If you visit only one "local" zoo, it should be this one.

Small, 18-acre zoo with an emphasis on education and conservation. Species include lions, kangaroos, tigers, snow leopards, zebras, porcupines, and lemurs.

360-acre safari park where visitors drive their cars through large animal exhibits to see free roaming animals including elephants, rhinos, black bears, giraffes, camels, and lions. There is also a walkthrough zoo, indoor and outdoor play areas, and a high ropes course.

Places marked with an asterisk (*) are slightly further, but still considered worthy of the list. Nothing in London is included on this list. 'NT' denotes a National Trust site, 'EH' denotes English Heritage sites.
